Have you noticed the Fassett GreenSpace Project in Wellsville?

Phase 1 of the project, funded by the Garmin Family of Buffalo and area folks, businesses and organizations, is a large-scale meditation labyrinth. It is a permanent art installation built with retaining wall blocks to create a series of circularly sculpted garden beds. The beds were filled with herbs and vegetables, all free to people willing to harvest; providing food for the Community Kitchen and used for a "Farm to Table" fundraiser. It has also been the setting for over 20 programs offering instruction in art, meditation, cooking, civic engagement and

fun for everyone!



Phase 2 was the installation of permanent outdoor percussion instruments funded by The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation. These instruments should be fully installed this Spring when you will also see a bronze fountain designed by Bill Underhill and cast with the help of students at Alfred University. Phase 3 will be the installation of pavers to allow accessibility to all, including baby strollers. Installation is dependent on funding. The locally made pavers will be an integral

element of the structure, holding the circular beds in place and providing a filter for rain water runoff into the Genesee River.
