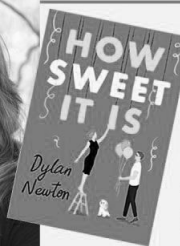

These duties include but are not limited to an annual application and report to be prepared for timely submission to the Tri-County Arts Council.

**Fundraiser (Unpaid Volunteer, Complimentary membership)** Coordinates fundraising concepts with AAA Board Members and Manages volunteers, publicity, and participation for fundraising events & activities in the local community to benefit AAA programming.

**Instructors (\$25 per hour)** Provides instructional art activities for local youth and adults in a public space. A class-outline approved by the AAA Youth Activities Director, intended age range of students, and number of students if class size needs to be limited should be provided. Classes could include drawing, painting, printing, writing, poetry, book arts, collage, music, movement, and so much more.

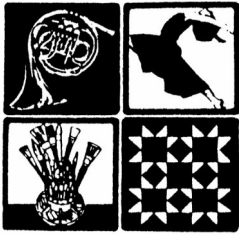
